TCH-Sarcee Interchange Update

Construction is underway on the TCH/Sarcee Trail Interchange. During the initial stages of construction, traffic will continue to move normally and work will take place off of the main roadways.

Bridge Detour

As of May 14, drivers will notice a small shift on the eastbound to southbound ramp to a 100-metre stretch of pavement that will allow work to begin on a new ramp. The speed limit on this ramp will be 30 km/hour and construction zone speed penalties will apply.

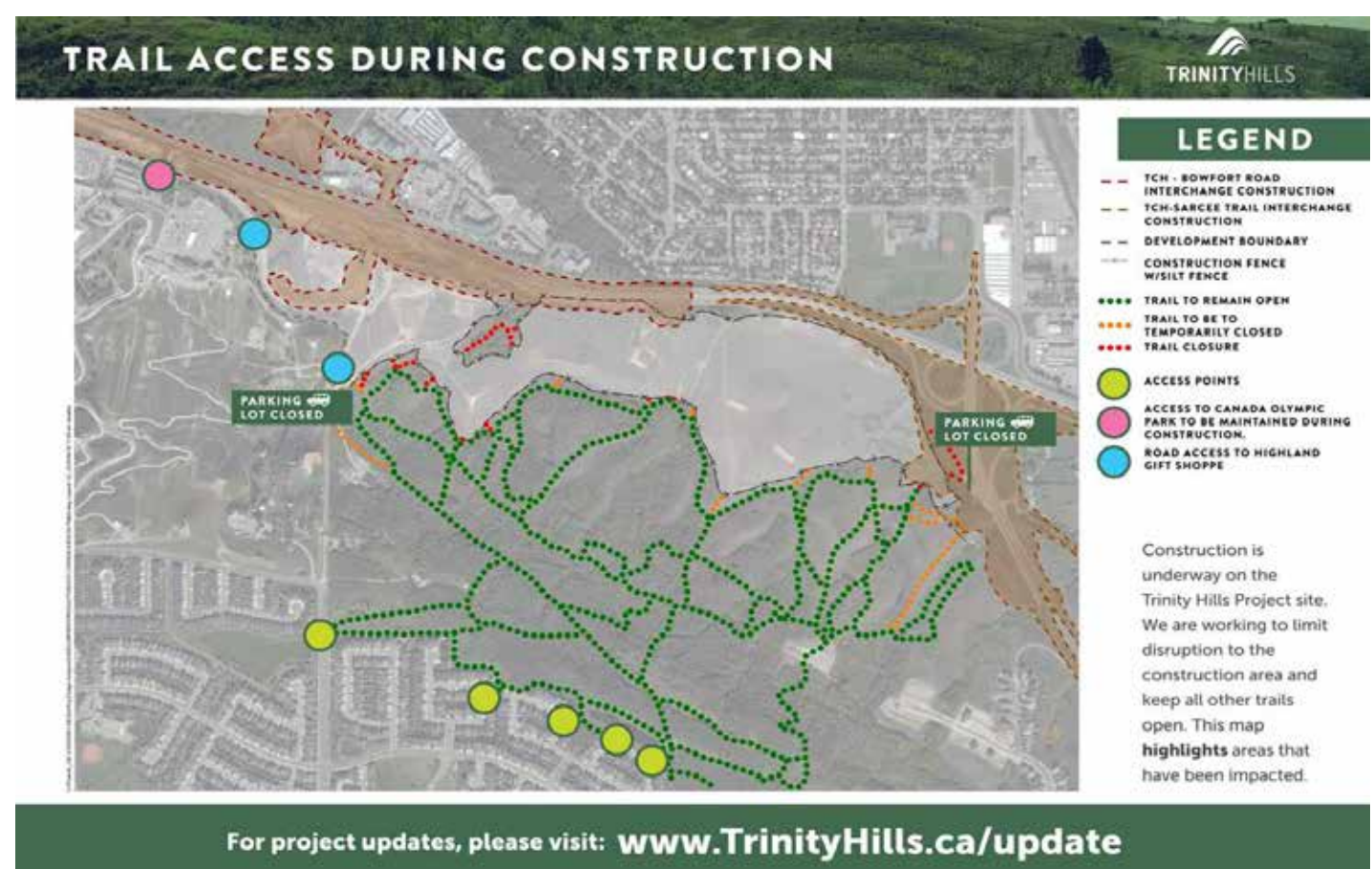
Construction to begin at Trinity Hills site

Site preparation has been completed on the Trinity Hills developable lands. In parallel, stripping and grading permissions have been granted under the rules of Trinity's Development Agreement with The City of Calgary. As such, we anticipate stripping and grading operations to begin shortly.

We are once again sharing the construction map that highlights the trails outside of the construction boundary that will continue to remain open for use at your own risk.

Access to the trails may be gained from Cougar Ridge at the top of the hill as parking areas off of Sarcee Trail and Bowfort Road are now closed. For your own safety, we ask that you respect and follow all signage. We thank you all for your patience and understanding during this time.
